DPAA Conference

I was very surprised and honored this year to be invited to a DPAA conference in Washington D.C. this past October to teach a class on tools I've used in researching MIA cases. DPAA, as I referenced in the last update, stands for the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency. They're the folks who continue to search for MIA's from all recent conflicts around the world. I spoke to the WWII European group. It was a terrific experience and I met some of these experts I've only heard about in the past. At the end of my presentation I was given a plaque to thank me for my efforts. It's something I will always treasure.

Lt. "Dud" Crouchley Excavation

Last year in my update I discussed the historical conference in Krakow where Stan Stanev presented the case of Lt. Crouchley (828th B.S.), whose crash site he found in Bulgaria. We were hoping that DPAA would send a team to Bulgaria and attempt to bring Lt. Crouchley home. We were elated to learn DPAA sent a team this past July to excavate the site and spent two months there. At this time they have not released any information, but we will provide information when we have it.

Arlington National Cemetery Burial

Since we don't have an annual newsletter anymore, we do not maintain a "Journeys End" list for 485th Vets we've lost in the past year. I know we've had several. One, Bill Ryan, passed away earlier this year. Bill was a good friend of mine. He was a copilot in the 828th Squadron. Bill will be buried at Arlington on December 13th, with full military honors. I will attend the funeral to represent the 485th. Another attendee will be our Austrian Historian friend, Jakob Mayer. I will be thinking of all of our Vets we lost this year.
